The secretary's primary duties are to prepare and distribute minutes of all Guild meetings (General, Executive and special meetings as required) and to handle incoming and outgoing Guild correspondence. Maintains records of minutes, policies, contracts and bylaws for reference and provides updates to the Registry of Joint Stock Companies.

Treasurer – currently Heather Rafuse (<u>wrafuse1@eastlink.ca</u>)

The Treasurer prepares the Guild's annual budget and monthly treasurer's reports, processes payments from members (dues, workshops, etc.), reimburses members for Guild-related expenses, serves as the contact person for banking issues and books/pays for Guild rentals. Maintains records pertaining to bank, insurance, CQA, and "Square" accounts. Advises the Committee on financial issues.

Researches, selects and books presenters for programs at monthly meetings. Handles contracts and correspondence pertaining to presentations or other special events.

Library Chair – currently Judy Cooper (judy.ltc@live.com)

Researches and sources new quilting publications suitable for purchase. Maintains records of items checked out and updates library lists for blog posting. Reviews library collection to remove outdated items.

A pandemic tale

I received this story from Debbie Breeze. I thought you might enjoy it.


A year ago, we arrived home from our winter travels in Europe to spend two weeks in self-isolation and many weeks with disrupted routines with lockdown in Nova Scotia. Once I had bounced back from a long, stressful trip that involved 4 cancelled itineraries, 4 days of travel from Malaga through Heathrow and Montreal to Halifax (usually 20 hours), I decided to tackle machine quilting with hopes of improving my skills - my first pandemic project. I used what I had on hand, joining small pieces of batting to make practice sandwiches and emptying my thread drawer for partial spools. As I finished a spool, I tossed it in a plastic container on my work table and included the bobbin cores from the pre-wounds. Eventually I ran out of leftover thread and had to use my 'good' cones. My sewing machine /thread stash covered a lot of distance when I couldn't.



As I worked through workshop handouts and Jacquie Gering's Walk series books (an early Amazon order) and browsed the internet for YouTube videos, I gathered all the hints and relevant websites and patterns in a binder for future reference. Here's one of my practice pieces, using some of the designs I preferred along with my annotated binder.

While I'm still learning and have more practice ahead, especially with free motion designs, I've been completing smaller projects with some skill and confidence. I'll be using some quilt-as-you-go techniques to finish larger quilts in manageable chunks. And a bonus - a tidy thread storage cabinet!

I'd be curious to know how others have spent their pandemic hours. My stack of UFOs is slowly dwindling.
