
Workshop News

We are sure everybody has been waiting eagerly for the allowances in this year's coming Quilt Show Boutique so they can get creating! Well here it is!

- * This year anything fibre related will be allowed. This opens it up to needlework, quilting, knitting, crocheting, hooking... If it's got fibre or you make a tool we use for our trade such as seam rippers, knitting needles, books, patterns, etc. we can use it.
- * That said we will do our best to fit everything we can into the store and try to keep it restocked continually, not everything will make it in as we are limited on space. This year we are working on some storage space and a way to make keeping some of your stock so we can bring out more as it sells. More information on those guidelines to come.
- * We will also be providing more information on inventory management as it gets worked out but please know EVERY SINGLE ITEM you have will need to be priced, likely with your three initials as a code in front of it. No bins with a price for all items in bin, EVERY item in that bin will need to have a tag on it. Please know this now so you can start tagging from the start. This will be strictly enforced.
- * Please also remember it is 15% commission to the Guild to sell in the Quilt Show Boutique and volunteering is not mandatory but appreciated.

Here are the guidelines:

The 2020 challenge is to create a quilt design, scene or image that has an optical illusion component using at least four of the fabrics provided, and a maximum of 2 other fabrics.

Technical Guidelines

--Enclosed are five fat quarters. All fabric is 100% cotton and has not been prewashed

- --Participants MUST use a recognizable piece of at least four of the provided fabrics on front of the entry piece, and MAY add a maximum of two other fabrics of their choice (any type or colour).
- --The quilted entry may be in any style (traditional, modern, art quilt) and use any construction techniques (piecing, applique, fusing, painting, printing etc.)
- --Embellishments of any type (thread, beads, wool, paint, etc.) and colour are permitted
- --The finished piece can be any shape, and the perimeter cannot exceed 120 inches.
- --A 2 inch sleeve must be attached to the back of your entry.
- --The completed challenge entry should be submitted at the regular September 2020 guild meeting, unless other delivery arrangements are confirmed.

Community Art Project

Laurie Swim has received the following email from Tracey Lawko. Laurie thought it might be of interest to the Members. If you are interested, the contact information is at the bottom of the email so you can get more information.

I am creating a large sculptural artwork that celebrates the many groups that make up the Canadian cultural mosaic. The Encyclopedia of Canada's Peoples identifies 127 such groups. I am seeking one participant for each of the 127 cultural groups. So far, I have participants representing about half, and I'm looking for the others.

I am asking participants to create a textile maple leaf. The work would either be the shape and size of a life-size maple leaf template which I will provide (preferred), or it could be a smaller square/rectangle that could be attached to a felt leaf. The work should represent the participant's ancestral/cultural group and they should be able to describe how the leaf links to their cultural group in a brief artist statement. The content is really up to them, but I am asking that they avoid commercial patterns, political symbols or flags.
