

2020 CQA/ACC Member Guild Challenge - Gateway to Adventure

Calling all CQA/ACC member guilds to join the adventure of the 2020 challenge. The guidelines for the challenge can be found here on our website. Below are the basic requirements.

THE CHALLENGE

THEME Gateway to Adventure

 Each quilt must have a visible amount of Kona® cotton, colour K001-147 Jungle, along with three (3) additional fabrics on the face of the quilt. The additional fabrics can be a

print or solid.

- Quilt perimeter to be no larger than 72 inches.
- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillowcase style.
- · Must include a hanging sleeve, at least three inches wide, for display purposes.
- Must have a quilt label on back with quilt name and quilter's name visible on it.

Here is Sabrina's description of her art quilt...

I did a series on farmland by season based on many road trips from Calgary to Edmonton. This winter early evening scene captures a Chinook. An indigo cloudy arch with a sunset peeking through at the edge and interesting patterns on the farmland from the sudden, uneven snow melt.

It is 31" by 23"

Materials used - hand dyed cottons, commercial cottons, silk and tulle. Embroidery and rayon thread.

Techniques used - hand embroidery. Use of a variety of fabrics including wrong side. Fabric painting. Machine and fusible applique. Home domestic machine quilting.
