

Projects	We will gratefully accept finished quilts of any size, preemie quilts, wheelchair quilts and walker bags. If your quilt needs binding, we have volunteers to complete your creation with machine or hand stitching binding. We will make every effort to have completed tops quilted, but we are limited in the number of quilts we can complete right away. We will not be making tied quilts this year.
Fabric	The Guild cupboard is bare, as we have given away our backings and stored fabric throughout the past year.
Batting	We do have some 80/20 batting remaining if you require batting to finish your quilt. It can be picked up at the March meeting. ## **BOOK REPORT**

## Wool Applique the Piece of Cake Way

## By Becky Goldsmith and Linda Jenkins

This is a time to re-visit some of our not so new books. We can miss out on some really good information when we do so.

What I really liked about this book is that it doesn't take 5 pages to explain what can be done in a two and a half. The book is laid out in a way that is the natural process of learning a new technique. Highlighting and bolding makes it easy to find information quickly.

The book contains a lot of information with regards to fabric choices, Felted Wool, Cotton and Linen. All used in the same projects. Good information about threads, fabric and template preparation for fusible applique, pattern tracing and how to use the template to applique all the different fabric choices. They use a different way to transfer the pattern onto the background. They trace the pattern onto a piece of vinyl and then use this to work the square. This is interesting because as a quilter that has done a lot of applique this would take care of my question every time, I start a new project. What kind of pen and what colour will work especially on dark colours. I have not done it yet but will use the technique on my next applique project.

When you move to sewing the project there is a wonderful section on several stitches with step-by-step instructions. This would really help anyone who has not done applique before. Includes inside and outside curves. The only missing instruction is how to do an invisible stitch for cotton, but my experience is that just takes practice.

It follows to finishing the quilt. How to quilt felted wool, make bias and straight grain binding and one technique on joining binding.

Throughout the book there are great pictures and little circles and squares the contain where you can find great tips. The second half of the book you will find 12 lovely quilt patterns with the paper patterns included.

All in all, this is a great book. I learned that I need to look at the library more closely for some of our older books. I am sure there are a lot of older books that will be filled with great information in the library. Have a look!!!!!

A quilting and fiber arts enthusiast, Krista started sewing at 8 years old. She began her professional sewing and machine quilting career at the spunky age of 14 and has been teaching sewing and quilting lessons for more than 20 years.

The **Vintage Windmill** pattern combines charming color combinations with simple shapes to create a secondary design that is deceptively easy.

For this project, you will be required to have the Creative Grids 60-degree Diamond Mini Ruler. Participants will be able to purchase the PDF pattern at a 50% discount.

Diamonds and triangles are arranged to create a one-of-a-kind quilt with <u>no</u> <u>Y seams</u>!

If you have been wanting to break out of the same old quilting routine and try something different, this pattern is just the thing.

# Skills Building Mini Workshop

April 2023

## Mahone Bay Quilt Guild

Judy Cooper, Instructor

### Purpose

This class is designed to introduce students to hand embroidery while practising some beginner stitches on a Practice or Doodle Cloth.

## Supply List

- One of the most essential tools for this workshop is a Doodle Cloth (sometimes called a trial cloth or Practice cloth. Choose a piece of muslin or other cloth that is easy to stitch on. (Batik is not a good choice for a practice cloth as it is tightly woven and harder for a threaded needle to penetrate.) The material can be the size of a fat quarter but no smaller than 12" wide, in case you need to hoop it.
- Small hoop (4"/ 6" /8") optional
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Needle threader
- Light source (optional)
- Pencil or heat sensitive marking pen / Frixion pen ... I use a pencil on my Doodle Cloth
- Embroidery Threads (DMC / Anchor stranded floss) Six colours or less is sufficient; #8 Pearl Cotton (one or two colours)
- Crewel / Embroidery Needles (sharp tip)
- Tapestry Needles (blunt tip)

For skills day, you don't need to have a large variety of needles. I suggest Crewel or Embroidery needles which come in a variety pack in sizes 1 – 12 and Tapestry needles (22 – 24) or whatever you might have in your needle collection.

## The Skill Builder Activity

The Activity will cover these beginner stitches, based on time.

- Running stitch
- Back stitch / Whipped back stitch
- Stem stitch / Whipped stem stitch
- Chain stitch
- Daisy stitch
- Seed stitch
- Blanket stitch
- French knot
- Couching

• Satin stitch

I will provide a list of reference resources for all the stitches.

Practice activities will use stitches in a straight line, and if interested, in shapes.


