# CQA/ACC Member Guild Quilt Challenge. Artist's Statement

It will be forever etched in my memories how my 4-year-old Albertan grandson was totally mesmerized watching that sailboat drift across the horizon. As he stood in the sun, with waves gently lapping at his feet, his maritime dreams probably included sun, sand, sea and sails.

#### **Design Inspiration**

I have always considered myself a traditional quilter but the desire to recreate this photo with fabric has taken me out of my comfort zone. After taking workshops from Kerry Foster (Calgary, AB) and Bev Crouse (Liverpool, NS), I created this wall hanging from a photo I took on August 4, 2022.

#### Techniques used.

I used mostly turned edge appliqué for the background. My grandson is a combination of turned and raw edge appliqué. The sailboat was paper pieced separately and added to the background. To make the water more realistic, I used four different colours of tulle. This project was my first using free-motion quilting as I am more comfortable with walking foot quilting on my domestic machine. As a lifelong learner, I appreciated a challenge!




#### The Fabric Cupboard

What a treat – a friendly shop owner surrounded by wall-to-wall beautiful fabrics with a colourful display of quilts on an upstairs railing. We found a wonderful selection of fabric lines, precuts and lots of notions in a bright friendly atmosphere. If you visit, don't forget to ask where the sale fabrics are – they were well priced and there was a nice selection.

### The Covered Bridge

Here you will find lots of fabric to choose from and a friendly, helpful staff. There is also a fabulous classroom with adjustable, mechanized sewing tables. Long arm quilting is done on site with local drop offs but also for quilts mailed to them. Icing on the cake is that the Quiltery has an online shop. Here you will find lots of fabric to choose from and a friendly, helpful staff.





# Spruce it Up Quilting in Port Elgin, NB

Jan has been a frequent visitor (and teacher) there, but it was my first visit to the store. Though a bit out of the way (unless you're headed to PEI), the shop is well worth the detour. The staff were friendly and helpful, with lots of fabrics to choose from. They are known for their one-meter fabric bundles - thoughtfully chosen, with coordinating fabrics in the store and a web site where you can also purchase them. The owner has beautiful examples of her wool applique hanging in the shop and lots of hand-dyed wool fabric on site.


Next our road trips took us to stores in Nova Scotia and the first one was almost 2 hours away but worth it.

#### Clarence Shopping Mart, Clare NS

A little bird set us straight (thank you, Peggy – you rock!) and told us to head for Foodland first. Yes, Foodland! Well, not exactly Foodland but to the other half of the same building, to <u>Clarence's</u> Shopping Mart at 10029 Hwy #1 in Clare –

It was in this store that we found a wonderful supply of fabrics with great pricing and the best supply of notions so far.





#### Panier d'Art

Just a short hop down the road is <u>Panier d'Art</u>, at 464 Hwy 1 in Saulnierville. You'll find the store in the back through the basement door. You're immediately surrounded with fabric bolts with a large section for flannels, another for new fabrics and yet another for their patterns and remaining fabric lines. They have a room full of sewing machines and equipment that also houses over 500 bolts of sale fabrics for \$9.99 or less. Classroom space is in a separate building.

This is just one of three rooms full of every quilter's dream.

#### The Wooden Spool

The shop has been open for about three years. It's a lovely shop, bright and airy, with a good mix of traditional and contemporary fabrics. There are lots of books on display and a wide variety of fabric panels.

The staff we met were all quilters so when we asked for help supplementing fabrics for an applique quilt, we stayed at the cutting table, and they brought us the fabrics. #### **Sew Blessings Kensington PE**

This is a bright, clean, and lovely store that can be found easily right off the highway between Summerside and Hunter River. Great selection of fabrics and the employees are quilters, so they are very helpful. There are lots of precuts, notions, books, thread and the fabrics are a nice mix. There is a bright classroom in the back of the store and classes were running when I was there. There are lots of classes so if you are travelling to PE see if they are funning something you might be interested in.

Next up the pattern for the pouch swap. Thanks, Eldora, for all your work.



It's time for our first guild swap with the Highland Quilters Guild (out of Antigonish) and we hope you'll join us! If you're anything like me, you have at least a zillion projects on your cutting table and more in your mind. So... what 's one more? I've heard a rumor that it's helpful to keep everything for a project corralled together so what better for this swap than a project pouch?

Several options were reviewed to find the best one for our swap – there are literally thousands of patterns and tutorials out there. We decided to use the Vinyl Project Pouch by Moda Bake Shop (Vinyl Project Pouch | modafabrics.com) because of its great size, fun look, and adaptability. And it's FREE! It finishes at 12" x 12". There's even a YouTube video (EASY Vinyl Zipper Pouch // Sewing Tutorial! - YouTube) to walk you through each step, including the zipper. Have no fear – the zipper is doable.

We'd like everyone to use this same pattern for the swap to keep them all equal in size and shape but would like you to go crazy making it your own. There's lots of ideas on Pinterest for inspiration. Check out #luckyprojectpouch on Instagram for even more inspiration.

#### MAY 2023 NEWLETTER

We want to ensure everyone who wants to participate will have a swap partner. As everyone's skill level is different, we ask that you put your best effort forward and expect the same in return.

Please bring your completed project pouch to the September meeting, wrapped and ready to exchange in a blind swap. The big reveal will be at the October meeting to ensure enough time is allotted for delivery of the pouches. Have fun picking fabrics, piecing, applique, quilting – whatever you'd like to do to put your own spin on it.
