The planning takes many months but with the execution of the last Quilt Show we developed detailed descriptions of what needs to be done to pull it all together.

We are seeking a Chair to oversee the planning and organization of the 2024 Quilt Show. The venue has been booked since the last show, but we can't proceed with any planning without a Chair or Co-chairs. If you and a friend wish to share this position the duties can be split to lighten the workload.

As the Chair for the last show, I will spend time reviewing the information with the Chair or Cochairs, that each committee member submitted, and the process we used to set up meetings and when we worked at the various jobs. Some parts of the process get done early in the planning and some get done closer to the event date.

The Quilt Show will need to have a Chair by the absolute date of October 15th, 2023. If there is not a Chair by this date, we will be forced to cancel our venue and our 2024 Quilt Show.

### Caretaker for Meeting Set Up at Trinity United Church Hall

The TUC has been working to secure a Caretaker since the previous one retired earlier this year. They have been unsuccessful so far. September's meeting was set up by several of us who arrived early to do so, and the take down was done by Colleen who is the administrator at the Church.

We are wondering if there are any members who live close by that may have a spouse, friend, child or grandchild that would be interested in doing a set up for our meetings. We would be able to pay the rate we paid the caretaker when we had that availability. This would only be for our monthly meetings and occasional special events such as "Skills" days and Workshops.

The alternative is to have members that can help with the setup to arrive early and assist with the setting up of tables and chairs. The basic set up is 50 chairs on the floor, podium at the front, and 6 tables (2 for membership/workshops, 2 for library and 2 for back of room sew and tell display).

The other part of this, is of course, the take down, after a meeting.

We will ask each person to put their own chair back on a stand. There may be some who can't do this, but there will be some who will put away more than one chair, so with that, we hope, it will work out.

I will keep in touch with Colleen, the TUC Administrator, to let you know when and if they are able to secure someone to take over as Caretaker.

#### 1. Marilyn Verburgh 9:30 – 11 & 11-12:30 Starched Heart Applique

I will supply the heart stencil, starch, brush, iron and glue stick as well as liquid.

#### Supply list;

• assorted scraps of fabric approximately 10" square, needle and thread.



## 2. Deanne Hemphill 9:30 – 11 & 11-12:30 Hand Turned Applique

We will be doing a whimsical little bird for this session, but feel free to bring a design of your choosing if you wish. Quilting cotton or batiks will work, but batiks are a little harder to needle. Contact me at <a href="deebabe525@gmail.com">deebabe525@gmail.com</a> if you have any questions.

#### **Supply List:**

- A 10" square of background fabric that you will be able to see through to trace on a light box (I will bring one) or on a window.
- A piece of fabric approximately 5" x 7" for the bird's body
- Small scraps for the wing, tail and beak
- A water soluble or heat erasable marker
- Matching threads for each fabric. Finer is better than heavier, but not critical. Bring what you have.
- A hand sewing needle #9, 10 or 11 betweens work well. I will have some to borrow if you need one.
- Smaller scissors for cutting fabric. 4" works well, but bring what works for you



#### 3. Krista Garber 1-2:30 & 2:30 – 4 Turned Edge Glued Applique

Our practice piece will be an apple. Simple, but it will teach you to applique any other shape you wish to make.

### **Supply List:**

- Piece of muslin or light-coloured background fabric about 10" square
- Scrap of green fabric about 4" square
- Scrap of fabric for your Apple red, yellow or green about 6" square
- Thread to match your leaf and apple scraps (any cotton thread, 50 weight or thinner)
- Scissors for cutting paper
- Small fabric scissors (anything with a sharp tip)
- Hand sewing needle & thimble (needle type is not crucial a "between" size 10 or similar is great)
- Note paper if you are a note-taking type

Optional – a small glue stick – glue samples will be provided
 You may use batik or quilting cotton fabric – batik will be just a bit trickier for beginners.

### 4. Sandy Emenau 1-2:30 & 2:30 – 4 Applique using interfacing

We will be making a flower. Any questions please email me at semenau@ iCloud.com. I will have a sewing machine available for us to use.

#### Supply list:

- piece of light coloured background fabric. 6" x 6" or larger
- scrap of green fabric for leaves
- scrap of fabric for petals of flower (6" x 6" is plenty)
- fusible interfacing
- scissors
- pen (Frixion or regular)
- needle and thread
