Last but not least, is #507 - The Big Book of Little Quilts. Several of you have asked about making smaller pieces for hanging on the wall, as well as table toppers. This book has four topics with various quilts to make: Fresh Takes; Retro Faves; Applique; and Holiday. There are 51 patterns in all,

ranging from 7" x 11 ½" to 40 ½" square (yes, I checked all 51 for sizes). Plenty for everyone. One of the patterns, Tiny Trees, which is paper pieced, caught my eye. I have the 15 trees all done. The modern, uncomplicated look of the wall hanging appealed to me. Depending on the colours selected for the trees, it could be seasonal.

The books will be on display at the next meeting. I will have a sign up sheet for each book. The first name gets it in March.

- place and/or pay for your order at the March 5th guild meeting.


