I know that the Guild used to volunteer to host the Festival Welcome Centre for this event, but this year we've been asked if any of our members have a quilt that they'd like to lend for a couple of days. This is a wonderful community event and we're so happy they asked us to be involved again!

Event: Christmas Market portion of "An Evening on Edgewater"

Location: St James Anglican Parish Hall

Date and Time: Friday December 6, 5 to 7 pm

Quilt Drop off: Thursday December 5, from noon to 4 pm at the venue

Quilt Pick up: Saturday, Dec 7, between 11am - 1pm at the Reindeer Run Registration building
(Kelley Marine, near the Mahone Bay Marina) or Monday, Dec 9, at St James Parish Hall, between 10

am and Noon (during regular office hours)

- Any size quilt or hanging welcome, from big to small. Seasonal is perfect, but not mandatory.
- Please securely pin a note on the back of the item with your contact information and put your quilt in a plastic bag or other holder.
- If you have a hanging sleeve or other option for hanging that's wonderful, especially if you also have a dowel or other suitable support.
- You can add a temporary hanging sleeve (just safety pin it on).

Guild member Donna Egan is coordinating these quilts. Please email her at dmegan291@gmail.com to let her know the size of the item(s) being lent and what the Festival will need in terms of hanging it.


Members are also reminded to bring a food or monetary donation for the Food Bank.

Workshops

Spaces are still available for the Biscotti Zoom Workshop on January 11th & 18th from 10 – 1. Deadline to register is January 8, 2025.

In this course you will learn Brandon Wulff's Biscotti process. We will make a sample quilt top measuring about 32 x 20 inches that can be configured in multiple ways.

Day 1, January 11th We will learn about the creation of the biscotti process and the work of Brandon Wulff. Quilt top to be completed for Day 2, January 18th.

Day 2, January 18th: We will cut and reconfigure the quilt top and sew it back together.

Supply List	 Sewing machine with a 1/4-inch foot Stache of fabrics - Brandon will go through this process on January 11th. Total of 10 fabrics but it's best to have more on hand. This quilt top can be made with 10 fat quarters. Neutral or coordinating thread to your fabric Rotary cutter a 3.5" x 3.5" ruler or template would be handy but not 100% needed Standard 24" ruler Cutting mat Iron and Spray starch A design wall
